









The Flinders Goolman Estate is some 2500 hectares in size and features Flinders Peak at 670m elevation which is visible from most areas of Brisbane, Moreton Bay, Ipswich and the surrounding districts – making it a scenic icon in South East Queensland.

Flinders Peak was noted by Matthew Flinders in 1799 during his navigation of Moreton Bay.

The combination of unique regional ecosystems, rare and threatened flora and fauna species as well as special biodiversity, geological and cultural, scenic and recreational values makes this a unique site in South East Queensland and a popular destination for bushwalkers and naturalists.

The flora of the Estate's vegetation (shrub land and shrubby woodland on rock pavement) has close similarities with the Moogerah Peaks, Mt Barney and Border Ranges to the south.

From Flinders Plum Picnic Area, walkers can access three different walking grades. Undertaking the Flinders Peak Hike requires a high level of fitness, rewarding adventurers with panoramic views of the surrounding districts.

The picnic and walking track areas are accessed from Mt Flinders Road, Peak Crossing. It is wise to contact the Ipswich City Council prior to access.
