

# Redlands Heritage Gardens

places to be

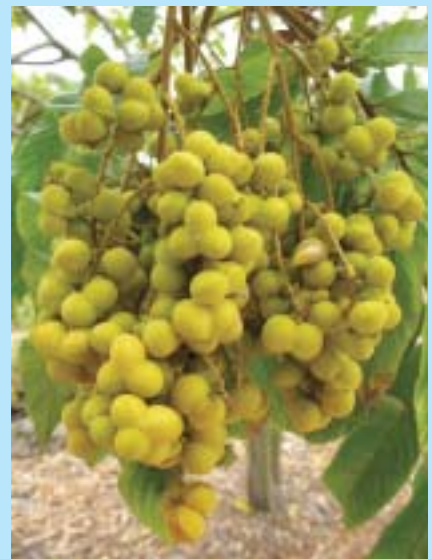
Opened in December 2001 with funding assistance from the Federal Government's Centenary of Federation Scheme, the Gardens celebrate the indigenous culture links to the land, history of the European settlement and the horticultural industry in the Redlands since Federation.

The interactive natural environment of the Redlands' rich soil in the Research Station has over the decades provided an educational resource for the public, colleges and schools. Banners and ceramic artworks are integrated into the Garden to capture elements of urban development and horticultural crop history of the district.



Features of the Heritage Gardens include:

- the salad bowl displaying rotational plots of vegetable and fruit;
- pioneers walk creates a timeline central theme and spine for the whole garden;
- formal garden represents the imposed European influences on nature;
- rose arbour to define space within this Garden;
- the bush reflects natural habitat prior to European settlement; and
- the snack track – an arboretum of medicinal and edible native plants local to the district. This track celebrates the Quandamooka People and their relationship to the local flora.



Tours are best coordinated with the volunteers who tend this garden weekly on Tuesdays.
