Tucked in between the Ipswich Motorway and the Ipswich train line, this 7 hectare park is a hidden treasure all too often overlooked by the locals.

Planting has focused on local plant species with local garden clubs actively involved in the direction of the planting scheme. Of interest is the dry-rainforest species planted in the eastern section of the park and when in flower can be seen from the motorway.

The Pan Pacific Peace Gardens was constructed to commemorate soldiers of World War II. Inspired by Ipswich's history, the Pan Pacific Peace Gardens feature memorial plantings, formalised pathways and boardwalks that wind through extensive wetlands. The gardens also act as a wildlife corridor linking Redbank Rifle Range with adjoining lands and rivers.

The park features a number of lagoons and offers all amenities, barbeque facilities, picnic tables and a meandering path that could be used by children on scooters or bicycles.
